Re: Gas Tax Report

The Clerk reports we received \$58,435.07 from the Missouri Department of Revenue for the fuel tax, motor vehicle sales tax and fee increases. Compared to last year's \$57,696.58.

Re: Request from VFW Post 11241 for Vending Space

Mayor Hark had the Clerk read the request from the VFW for use of three parking spaces on the City Hall side of Broadway for vending refreshments for July 2nd, 3rd, and 4th during the 4th of July Celebration.

Re: Board Appointments

Mr. Shimun presented Council with a list of his suggested appointments to several board and commission positions to be considered at the next meeting.

GEORGE PACE – CITIZEN

Re: Public Acknowledgement of John Beckley Memorial Plaque in the 300 Block of North Main

Since Mr. Pace was not at the meeting to make his comments, a motion was made by Council Member Dexheimer to table this agenda item. Motion was seconded by Council Member Behymer.

Motion carried.

MICHAEL GAINES – HANNIBAL ARTS COUNCIL
Re: Request to Close Parking Lot Entrance of 1221 Market for Art Dedication Ceremony

Council Member Dexheimer made a motion that the City Clerk read the request from Mr. Gaines, since he was not present. Motion was seconded by Council Member Wilson.

Motion carried.

The City Clerk then read aloud the request for Mr. Gaines, asking permission on behalf of the Arts Council to close the Broadway and Market Street entrances to their parking lot on Saturday, July 14, from the hours of 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. At that time they are having a ceremony for a public art piece, which will be installed on the outside of their building. A motion was made by Council Member Morgan, seconded by Council Member Behymer to approve this request.

PRISCILLA LONG – CITIZEN
Re: Request to Close Portion of Carriage Road for Annual Block Party

Mrs. Long requested that half of Carriage Road in the Surrey Hills Subdivision be closed on June 30, 2001 (rain date of July 31, 2001) for their annual block party. Motion was made by Council Member Wilson, seconded by Council Member Behymer to approve the request.

C. TODD AHRENS – EVENING KIWANIS
Re: 4th of July Arts & Craft Festival in Central Park

Mr. Ahrens requested that 4th Street, between Broadway and Center be closed to through traffic in order to accommodate the Arts and Craft Festival that will be held in Central Park. The Kiwanis are requesting closure of this area on July 4th from 10:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. and on the 5th from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. It was a concern of the Council

that City Hall would be open for business on July 5th. They asked that the barricades be moved to allow access to the handicap space on the 4th Street side of City Hall on the 5th. Motion was made by Council Member Wilson to approve. Motion was seconded by Council Member Behymer.

FRANCES TILLER – CITY COLLECTOR
Re: Report of Delinquent taxes

Ms. Tiller presented Council with a report of delinquent real estate and personal taxes and asked Council's approval to write-off these taxes. The state allows this to be done within three years from the date of delinquency.

The amounts were as follows: 1994 - \$4,898.43, 1995 - \$6,283.06, 1996 - \$9,288.93 and 1997 - \$12,044.72, making a total tax write-off of \$32,515.14.

A motion was made by Council Member Wilson to approve, seconded by Council Member Behymer.

Motion carried.

Ms. Tiller also asked Council's permission to allow her to start implementing a program that allows people to pay delinquent taxes on the installment plan and would also allow partial payments for taxes when the need arises. Motion to approve was made by Jim Dexheimer, seconded by Council Member Behymer.

BILL LANKFORD – PARKS & RECREATION SUPERINTENDENT
Re: Trash Bids

Mr. Lankford presented the bid results of the trash pick up contract of the City for the upcoming year. Lowest bidder was Wamsley Disposal; Mr. Lankford requested that Council approve them for this purpose. Motion was made by Council Member Dexheimer, seconded by Council Member Behymer to award the bid to Wamsley for our trash removal.

Re: Memorandum of Agreement Between the City and the Missouri State Historic Preservation Officer for the Cardiff Hill Park Lighthouse Stairway Project

Mr. Lankford presented a copy of the agreement and explained that this is something the Highway Department regards as necessary in order to complete the project.

Motion was made by Council Member Dexheimer, seconded by Council Member Behymer to approve.

MARY BETH BAUDENDISTEL – CITY CLERK
Re: Vacation Request for Department Heads

The City Clerk stated that it was brought to her attention that Department Heads who had recently been hired had been allowed to negotiate for more vacation time. Those in the past, along with the department heads who were promoted from within, were not even aware that they had such an option available. She asked that Council approve granting all department heads a four (4) week vacation, regardless of whether they were hired from the outside or promoted from within.

Motion to approve this request was made by Council Member Morgan, seconded by Council Member Wilson. During discussion, Council Member Dexheimer stated that he did not feel comfortable making a blanket decision stating that all department heads hired in the future would be getting four weeks vacation.

Council Member Behymer made a substitute motion that we table this item for the time being and meet with department heads and supervisors to discuss vacation procedures. The procedure will then be put into force so that we will have something to go by in the future that would be fair to everyone concerned. Motion was seconded by Mayor Hark.

COUNCIL MEMBER JIM DEXHEIMER
Re: Use of Protective Safety Helmets by Persons Under the Age of Seventeen

Mr. Dexheimer stated that several individuals requesting that the Helmet Ordinance be revisited had approached him. He then asked the Mayor's approval of opening this item to interested parties for discussion. Mayor Hark approved this request and called upon Dr. Bubolz from the audience who wished to be recognized.

Dr. Bubolz then proceeded to state that he represented more than 240 citizens who were in favor of passing this ordinance. He had a petition with these signatures in his possession. He then gave statistics to Council with regards to bicycle fatalities that reinforced the need for this ordinance. Dr. Bubolz asked Council's consideration in approving this bill for a first reading when it was presented later in the meeting. After a lengthy discussion, Council Member Behymer encouraged the rest of Council to get in touch with their constituents concerning how they actually feel about this ordinance, so they could be better informed when it came time to approve.

Re: Mutual Aid Agreement with the Monroe City Fire Department

Council Member Jim Dexheimer, on behalf of the Fire Board, asked Council's approval allowing the Mayor to sign this agreement that would be presented later in resolution form.

Council Member Dexheimer then asked Mayor's permission to add an additional item under his name. Mayor Hark approved.

Re: Interim Chief – Major Joey Runyon Salary

Council Member Dexheimer stated that since Major Runyon has been serving as interim Police Chief from the retirement of the former Chief and will be serving as such until the new police chief is permanently in place, he would like to make a motion that Major Runyon's pay be increased. He requested that the increase be equal to what the former police chief's salary would have been, retroactive from November 3rd, 2000, the retirement date of the former police chief and ending when the new police chief is permanently in place. Motion was seconded by Council Member Wilson.

COUNCIL MEMBER DARBY MORGAN

Re: Ordinance Amending Article IV, Offenses Against Public Morals, Chapter 16 of the Hannibal City Code

Council Member Morgan explained that this ordinance is to be addressed later in the agenda. She then asked City Attorney Bob Curtis to explain to Council how the request for this ordinance occurred.

Mr. Curtis stated that Faye Bleigh and Major Runyon had brought to his attention the fact that there were gaps of enforceability in some of the ordinances that were on our books. For this reason, he was asked to update those ordinances so that they would be clearer and more easily enforced by the police department.

RICK JOHNSON – ASSISTANT TO THE CITY ENGINEER

Re: Additional Trees to be Added to Previously Awarded Tree Removal Bid

At a previous meeting, Council approved a bid award for tree removal of several listed trees to Wilson's Tree Removal. In the meantime, there have been other trees brought to the department's attention that should also be removed, therefore he asked Council's approval to add these additional trees to the previous list given to Wilson's Tree Service. Wilson's is willing to do these for the same rate. Mr. Johnson stated that since Wilson's Tree Removal was the only company bidding on the last tree job, he felt that this would be fair. Motion was made by Council Member Dexheimer, seconded by Council

Member Behymer to approve Johnson's request. Council Member Wilson asked to abstain from the vote on this item.

JIM BURNS - CITY ENGINEER
Re: Street Department Uniform Rental Bids

Mr. Burns presented the bids for uniform rental, floor mats and shop towel service. He recommended that Council approve the bid submitted by White Star Laundry, Inc. Council Member Dexheimer made motion to approve, seconded by Council Member Behymer.

Re: Annual Bids for Street Department Materials

Mr. Burns presented the annual bids for the street department materials and made the following recommendations for approval to Council:

Re: Traffic Committee Recommendations

Mr. Burns presented recommendations of behalf of the Traffic Committee.

RESIDENTIAL HANDICAP PARKING

- A. Eliminate Handicap Parking in Residential Areas
- B. Alternate Option – Allow Handicap Parking in Residential Areas with the Following Criteria:

Proposed Criteria for Residential Handicap Parking

- 1. Must own a vehicle properly licensed/tagged or be a legitimate dependent of an individual owing a properly licensed/tagged parking space
- 2. No available vehicle access to property
- 3. Curb cut/ramp installed at owner’s expense with city permit
- 4. Ramp to house
- 5. Vehicle may not stay in the space more than 48 hours without being moved (This is the same as all on-street parking).
- 6. Not more than two (2) handicap spaces per block; limit of one (1) on each side of street
- 7. Request will be granted for not more than one year. All existing spaces must be renewed by April 30th each year

Proposed handicapped Ramp Curb Cut Criteria

- 1. Medical documentation if need is not obvious
- 2. Ramp from sidewalk to entrance of residence
- 3. At least 60 feet from an existing handicapped access ramp

HARRISON HILL/PALMYRA ROAD SPEED LIMIT

Establish “30 MPH” speed limit all the way through Palmyra Road/Harrison Hill, beginning at the intersection of I-72 to the Intersection of Highway 61 North.

Motion was made by Council Member Wilson to approve all the traffic committee recommendations and implement the alternate option for handicap parking. Motion was seconded by Council Member Dexheimer.

Re: Road Evaluation Study

For Council’s information, Jim Burns reported on the findings of the road evaluation study done by Value Engineering.

Re: Agreement with Missouri State Highway Transportation Commission for Bridge Replacement and Rehabilitation Program

Mr. Burns asked Council’s approval of the upcoming resolution for an agreement with the Missouri State Highway Transportation Commission Bridge Replacement and

Rehabilitation Program which was for moving and replacing the existing bridge on Lindell Avenue. Council Member Behymer objected to this arrangement. He said that in a previous Council Meeting, Council had agreed that the residents of this particular area would not lose this bridge and the railroad crossing was to remain open at this point. He asked that the City Engineer check into this in the past minutes to see if that was correct.

JERRY KELLEY – CITY PLANNER
Re: Cer V Subdivision

Mr. Kelley presented Council with a plat and description of this proposed Subdivision that is located on Highway 36 West and asked Council to approve the upcoming bill concerning this plan.

Re: Community Development Block Grant Programs

Mr. Kelley described several of the upcoming resolutions and bills all pertaining to requirements involved in obtaining this grant for the City of Hannibal and asked Council's consideration in approving these necessary items.

Re: Outer Road I-72 (US 36) Between Lake Apollo Drive and Munger Lane

Mr. Kelley presented a letter from Assistant Chief David Hymers regarding their recommendations for closure of this outer road. Council Member Dexheimer suggested that the comments of this letter be put on the next Fire Board agenda in order for them to make a recommendation to the Missouri State Highway Department regarding closure of this road.

Re: Application Process for Designating the Maple Street Area as a Possible Historic District

Mr. Kelley introduced Ms. Karen Baxter of the Marion County Historical Society. She explained the process by which an area is designated a historical area and the advantages of being declared such. She then gave an update to Council on where the Historical Society is with regard to obtaining this status for the Maple Street area and presented a map showing parts of this area that would be involved.

Mr. Kelley described both agreements involved in continuing this project and urged Council to approve the two upcoming resolutions that were necessary for this project.
