JEFF LAGARCE – CITY MANAGER Re: Acceptance of ROW Easement - Right of Way Agreement

Mark Harris – 1304 Mark Twain Avenue (Resolution No. 1690-10, to follow)

City Manager LaGarce introduced the next item on the agenda, the acceptance of a right-of-way easement offered by Mr. Mark Harris, owner of the property located at 1304 Mark Twain Avenue. This would be done by Council approval of related Resolution No. 1690-10, to follow. In September 2010, Council authorized the repair of the stormwater vault located below Mr. Harris' property on Mark Twain Avenue. Since the City does not own this stormwater vault, an easement was required from Harris in order to make the needed repairs.

According to LaGarce, the right-of-way easement was prepared by City Attorney James Lemon and Mr. Harris' attorney, and has been executed by Mr. Harris. Although easements granted to the City do not typically require Council approval, this easement serves as a property dedication, and will require reasonable inspections, maintenance and repairs of the stormwater vault, consistent with the recommendations provided by the city's insurance company, who has participated in the problem from its beginning.

LaGarce asked Council to approve Resolution No. 1690-10, to follow, adding that the project should take several weeks to design and several weeks to construct. The final product is expected to possess the structural integrity as if the vault were new.

BILL MADORE – ACTING FIRE CHIEF Re: Purchase Approval, Various Nozzles

Towers Fire Apparatus

Acting Fire Chief Bill Madore came before Council to seek approval for a bid award with regard to the purchase of various nozzles. Madore explained that in April, the Fire Department was awarded an 'Assistance to Fire Firefighter' grant in the amount of \$37,100. This award is for 95% funding by FEMA with the City providing a 5% match. Nozzles were researched and field tested. As a result, specifications were developed and a sealed bid process was sent out. Three bids were received and opened on October 29th.

In review of the bids received, it was discovered that two out of three vendors did not meet the specifications set forth; therefore, Madore requested that the bid be awarded to Tower Fire Apparatus, the only company meeting all specifications in the amount of \$23,932.40. He added that the Fire Department has budgeted the required match for this award. Motion was made by Mayor Hark to approve Madore's request. Motion was seconded by Council Member Louderman.
