On Tuesday April 10th, 2019 the Hannibal Street Department went out for bids on our Annual Materials. The Big Tabulation's came in on the attached sheets, but I would like to give a price breakdown of each bid and any changes from our bids last year.

I recommend the bid award go to the following suppliers:

Prices on our fuel took a split down the middle this year on pricing, our regular fuel dropped in pricing, but our diesel fuel raised in costs. We did receive a cover letter from Big River Oil that stated our Smart Cards/Flex Fuel cards used at the bulk plant, General Store or Boland Tire would ensure cheaper prices for us between \$.02 and \$.10 cents, but we no longer use these cards. I called to confirm that our Wex Fuel cards would offer the same discount and per John Brokes, their Fuels Manager this will be honored with the Wex Cards as well.

This year we received two bids for our Liquid Calcium Chloride Bid. The bid from SICALCO was the same as last year but does require a 4-day waiting period for product. The bid from MO State Petroleum came in at a much higher price at \$1.27 per gallon but we can receive in a 24-hour period if necessary. Our crews have always been very responsible at knowing when our supplies are running low to order so that we don't find ourselves in a position to need to order in an emergency and feel confident in using the bid from SICALCO. We have used this company the past few years and have been satisfied in their product.

This upcoming year for our concrete bids we would like to allow for both companies to have an open bid. The reason being is that if one of the companies listed above is currently pouring a bigger concrete job elsewhere, we may not be able to get the concrete that we need due to low supply. If both companies have an open bid, then we could use the other company if the above situation occurred. Also, the price didn't change from the bids that were received last year so our budgeted amounts can remain the same as last year.

Bleigh Ready Mix came in substantially lower in price this year with a bid that is \$11.00 cheaper per cubic yard than mark Twain Ready Mix. This bid is also \$10.00 cheaper than what the bid was sitting at one year ago which will help with our budget pricing. It will be our recommendation to use only Bleigh Ready Mix for the CLSM this year.

Two bids were received this year for our asphalt bid, Diamond Construction and Emery Sapp and Sons. Emery Sapp and Sons has replaced CB Asphalt but will work out of the same asphalt plants that we have obtained asphalt in the past. Normally we purchase all our asphalt locally here from the Hannibal plant but there have been a few instances where this plant has been down or only mixing for another job and we are unable to get the supply we need. In this instance it is nice to have a back up plant to get patch at if needed. The bids this year came in the same for Diamond in the amount of \$115.00 a ton and higher with Emery at \$130.00 a ton. Last year our numbers were \$120.00 a ton for our local plant. Even though our number have increased we would like permission to accept both bids for the reasons stated above.

Two bids were received this year for our asphalt bid, Diamond Construction and Emery Sapp and Sons. Emery Sapp and Sons has replaced CB Asphalt but will work out of the same asphalt plants that we have obtained asphalt from in the past. Over the last few years we have asked Council to accept the bids from both companies since they have been so close in price and in case we ran into an instance where our local plant wasn't running and we needed asphalt we had the option to go into Illinois and purchase it as an option. Since the bids came in close in price again this year, we would again like to ask for that option. Our bids came in close with a slight

increase from Emery Sapp and Sons from \$60.00 last year per ton (CB Asphalt) to \$64.00 ton this year.

Two bids were received this year for rock salt. The low quote was from Compass Minerals at \$86.50/ton. This also came with a stipulation that we must purchase at least 400 tons. This is more then we usually purchase in one year but I would like to go ahead and get a large stockpile in place. If we have a mild winter next year we may not need to purchase any or very little salt the following year. If we have a bad winter like we did this year, we will have plenty of supply and no need to scramble for more during the winter.

RE: Amendment to Deed of Conservation Easement

Early in January of 2017 the City purchased two parcels of land, approximately 1.25 acres, located at the corner of Patchen and St. John's Street adjacent to the Sodalis Nature Preserve. The Conservation Fund agreed to reimburse the city for the purchase of this land as long as the City agreed to include it in the same Conservation Easement as the Sodalis Nature Preserve.

The Parks Department would like to amend the original "Deed of Conservation Easement" to include this approximately 1.25 acre tract of land (Tract 2). The amendment to the easement will allow the City to protect and preserve this second tract of land by subjecting it to the same easement on tract 1 and binds the City and all future owners in perpetuity.

Included with this memo and resolution is the contract amendment, legal description, maps and overview of the original Deed of Conservation Easement, including permitted and restricted uses.

The Parks Department recommends the amendment to the original deed of conservation easement with the Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation which includes the 185 acre Sodalis Nature Preserve (Tract 1). The amendment will add two parcels that are approximately 1.25 acres (Tract 2) that was purchased in 2017 to the original agreement and bind it by the same permitted uses and restrictions.

This is in reference to our current residency policy and a change I would like to see made to help with our recurring hiring situation. We currently have a 20 mile residency policy. It is 20 miles to the nearest city limits marker. This was implemented back when we still had a Fire Board in effect. It is in ordinance form and would require two readings to change. I would like to see this changed to 35 miles to the nearest city limit marker. I will give you some examples and why I would like to see this change.

In the past several years, we have had very limited applicant pools. We advertise in the paper, on our website and on our Facebook page. We also have it on a few hiring websites from advertising in the Hannibal Courier Post. We have had on average in the last several hiring pools about 40 applicants. Most of them are limited on certifications that we require in the fire service. This is not a Hannibal problem nor is it a fire service problem, but a problem in our work force today. People coming out of school today are more interested in the technology field. We are also very stringent in our testing procedure. The applicants have to pass a physical, drug screen and a psychological evaluation.

Once we make a hire, if they don't have their EMT licensure and Firefighter I and II certifications, we require this be done in the first couple of years of employment with us. If they already have these certifications and licensures, this is to their advantage. That being said, we recently teamed with MACC to help with the certification process. When we started the program, we had hoped to spark interest in the field and be able to hire candidates from this program. MU and the Division of Fire Safety even teamed with our departments from Hannibal, Kirksville Moberly and Macon. The program was grant-funded, meaning at little or no cost to the students. The numbers are good, but not what you would expect for a class that gets you ready for the state certification test for Firefighter I and II plus Hazmat awareness and operations certifications at little or no cost to the students. It takes a few months and the students must invest the time.

We are competing with several fire departments in our region. Quincy Fire Department, Tri-Township Fire Department, Moberly, Macon and Kirksville for the same qualified applicants. This is a problem when you have a limited number of qualified candidates and we are all trying to hire the same viable candidates.

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We always try to take local candidates first, but are very limited in the Hannibal area with the certifications required and from the testing procedure being very stringent and challenging process. It is very hard to get quality candidates locally.

We have two main highways coming through Hannibal and would like to make it less restrictive to surrounding towns in our region. If you look at the other attachments, it will show you the mileage to surrounding towns in the area on both sides of the river and the comparative population radii to Quincy, one of our biggest competitors for qualified applicants.

In closing, I would like to recommend changing the current residency of 20 miles to the nearest city limit marker, to 35 miles to the nearest city limit marker. I feel this would give us opportunity for more viable candidates in our future testing procedures for new hires.

Re: Ordinance Amending Chapter 32–Zoning Relative to Medical Marijuana Facilities

Date: April 1, 2019

Amendment 2 was approved by Missouri voters on November 6, 2018. Amendment 2 modifies the Missouri Constitution by creating a new Section 1 of Article XVI, making to lawful under certain conditions to manufacture, cultivate, dispense, transport, prescribe, and use marijuana for medical purposes. Pursuant to Amendment 2, these activities will be strictly governed, licensed, overseen, and enforced by the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services.

Amendment 2 allows state-licensed physicians to recommend marijuana to Qualifying Patients with certain medical conditions. Per Amendment 2, prescriptions can come in many forms: ointments, pills, infused-food, vapors, etc.

Regardless of how one voted on Amendment 2, Missouri voters approved this amendment 66% to 34%, and is now law. Many Missouri cities are now amending their zoning codes to address medical marijuana facilities. Why? Because Amendment 2 makes clear cities cannot prohibit these uses through exclusionary zoning, nor enact ordinances making them "unduly burdensome". Cities may enact ordinances that don't conflict with Amendment 2, but restrictions are limited to matters of time, place, and manner. Outlawing them is not an option.

Amendment 2 defines four (4) types of medical marijuana facilities (and so does the zoning Bill):

- 1. Medical marijuana dispensary a retail store for qualifying patients
- 2. Medical marijuana cultivation facility grows the product
- 3. Medical marijuana infused-products manufacturing facility processes the product
- 4. Medical marijuana testing facility tests the product

Since the ability of medical marijuana facilities to locate here is a foregone conclusion, it is important for the city to create Permitted Use categories, where appropriate. Restated, it behooves the city to identify an appropriate zoning district for each Use; otherwise they may end-up in locations where they're not appropriate.

Medical Marijuana Dispensary

In-order to purchase product from a dispensary, Qualifying Patients or Caregivers (both are legal terms from Amendment 2) must possess a valid ID Card issued by the Missouri Department of Health and Senor Services. As a Use group, dispensaries bear close resemblance to pharmacies. Use factors like (i) customer and vehicular traffic, (ii) shipments and delivery patterns, (iii) sales occurring internal to the building, (iv) lighting, (v) noise, (vi) trash pickup, (vii) operating hours, etc. should closely-resemble pharmacies. Therefore, dispensaries are being included as Permitted Uses in the C, D, E, E-1, and F Zoning districts as General Retail (identical to the zoning treatment of pharmacies). Unlike pharmacies however, dispensaries are being excluded from the H-1 Historic District. Why? The historic district is space-limited (only 4 blocks long); and largely comprised of tourist goods, services, and attractions. A non-tourism Use like dispensaries would consume scarce retail space in the historic district, leaving less space for future attractions and themed shops. In short, a dispensary is not the highest and best use in the historic district.

Medical Marijuana Cultivation Facility

While Amendment 2 allows cultivation facilities indoors and out, they are likely to be indoors, in industrial buildings. Midwest weather plays some part, but the security provisions required by Amendment 2 make outdoor cultivation facilities difficult to contemplate. Cultivation facilities are very similar to manufacturing and are therefore recommended for the F-Industrial district only; like any other type of factory. Cultivation facilities in commercial districts would not constitute the highest and best use. They would consume productive areas for retail growth. Also, commercial corridors like McMasters aren't conducive for industrial-style shipping activity.

Medical Marijuana Infused-Products Manufacturing Facility

By definition, this <u>is</u> manufacturing, and prescribed for the F-Industrial district only.

Medical Marijuana Testing Facility

Testing facilities include science and technology components. Given the nature of lab work and need for suitable office space to collect and store data, testing facilities are being prescribed in the D-Highway Business district and above (which by-extension, also includes the E, E1, and F districts). However, it would not include C-Local Business, nor the H1 Historic District. This Use is being treated as commercial; similar to commercial office or medical labs.

The zoning Bill prescribes Permitted Uses as shown below. Green represents districts permitting a particular Use, while red represents districts excluded. No residential districts are affected.

This zoning Bill incorporates Amendment 2 definitions for each of the four (4) Uses directly into our zoning code, and each definition includes a 400 feet setback from churches, daycare centers, and schools. Amendment 2 states:

"Unless allowed by local government, no new medical marijuana cultivation facility, medical marijuana testing facility, medical marijuana dispensary facility, or medical marijuana infused-products manufacturing facility shall be initially sited within 1,000 feet of any then-existing elementary or secondary school, child day-care center, or church".

Why employ a 400 foot setback, rather than 1,000 feet? These Amendment 2 businesses are now "baked" into the MO Constitution. They are immune from the MO Legislature, they are subject to intense State regulation, and they aren't going away. Given this, a number of cities are viewing these Uses as new job opportunities for local citizens - *legal* job opportunities in manufacturing, retail, and lab/science work.

The chart here illustrates how other cities are addressing setback provisions relative to schools,

churches, and daycare centers. This is all brand new - only a few cities have actually adopted anything thus far. Figures in the chart represent either (i) what's been adopted, or (ii) what's being recommended to those particular Planning & Zoning Commissions and City Councils. The chart isn't selective data presentation. I included every city I could identify who's currently in-process of making amendments. Several were identified only by contacting the medical marijuana trade association in St. Louis, to learn what other cities are doing. I suspect there are additional cities deliberating these measures, but I cannot identify them, or what they're recommending.

In-context, a 1,000 foot setback spans the equivalent length of 3 city blocks in downtown Hannibal. 1,000 feet represents the center-point of the 4th Street intersection to the center-point of the 7th Street intersection, and so forth on down-the-line. 1,000 feet is a tremendous setback distance, and could needlessly "regulate" 30-40 new quality jobs right-out of your community. Why should

those jobs instead go elsewhere (Monroe City, Palmyra, etc.)? These jobs are perfectly legal, and will be subject to greater oversight and regulation that most businesses in Missouri.

Antidotally, most people with whom I've spoken about Amendment 2 – which is a great many – opposed the ballot issue on November 6. I understand the concern; I share it. Yet, investors wishing to open any of these new Uses in Hannibal will bring new jobs and new investment to this community. It behooves the city to treat these businesses similar to traditional business enterprises – and secure those new jobs and investment (Amendment 2 states you *must* treat them similar).
