SECTION ONE: The Council hereby vacates and abandons a tract of land beginning at the southwest corner of Block 5 of Buchanan's Addition to the City of Hannibal, thence South 89 degrees 52 minutes 43 seconds East on the south line of Block 5 a distance of 140.00 feet, thence leaving said south line South 00 degrees 40 minutes 22 seconds West parallel with the west line of Block 5 and the east line of Valley Street 25.00 feet to the centerline of Choteau Street, thence North 89 degrees 52 minutes 43 seconds West on said centerline and parallel with the south line of Block 5 a distance of 140.00 to the intersection of said centerline with the east line of Valley Street, thence North 00 degrees 40 minutes 22 seconds East on the east line of said Valley Street 25.00 feet to the point of beginning, containing 0.08 acres, more or less, subject to any recorded or unrecorded easements across said lands.





SUBJECT: Transmittal Letter for FY-2024 Budget

It is my pleasure to present the preliminary FY-2024 budget. Pursuant to the Charter, the budget must be presented to and approved by the council no later than the second Monday in July.

The budget does not include the Hannibal Free Public Library or the Hannibal Board of Public Works, as they operate independently and autonomously.

Staff has worked hard to prepare a transparent budget; that is, revenue and expenditure line items are disclosed in a format which shows revenue and expenditures by department.

The budgeting process for this year continues to be challenging, as aftereffects of the pandemic continue to contribute to uncertainty regarding supply chain disruption, inflation, and enduring impact on economy. With these unknowns, we are budgeting for the General Fund to have a slight decrease over previous year estimated revenues. The budgetary number of the ending fund balance is inflated by grant revenues of nearly a million dollars. The actual estimated increase in ongoing revenue does not keep up with the cost of inflation and the increase in operating expenses.

Items of note include:

- Park Fund the main project for FY 24 will be the Sodalis Shelter.
- General Fund Revenues continue to be difficult to project due to ongoing anomalies, beginning with 2019's year record flooding and 2020's beginning of the Covid19 pandemic, which has contributed to supply chain issues and inflation.
- ARPA Funding AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021 provided for 2 tranches of funding, to be used under specific guidelines, or alternatively, by choosing to select the "standard allowance" for lost revenue. This budget continues to reflect the utilization of the standard allowance under the Final Rule and will allow for streamlined reporting requirements.
- Streets The Street Department anticipates doing a minimum of \$750,000 of paving.

Due to the 2019 Spring flood, on May 1, 2019 the Mayor sent a City of Hannibal Emergency Declaration for Flood Relief to the Governor. Federal and State declarations have subsequently been made and the City Clerk has been working on supplying the necessary documents for reimbursement. The City remains hopefully in receiving FEMA and/or SEMA reimbursements in the 2023 fiscal year. We do not anticipate receiving any further FEMA/SEMA reimbursements.

As previously mentioned, the pandemic and its effects on inflation and the supply chain remain a complicating factor in the budgeting process. Departments will continue to budget conservatively.

Additionally, I was able to negotiate the Corps rebuild of the downtown Pump Station, which estimates place at \$650,000 if the City had been responsible for the cost, and the repair of the North Street failure from the foot of the levee to the eastern most alleyway at a \$1,061,457.50 project cost. Both were completed by the Corps of Engineers at NO COST to the city. These one time funds allowed the City to complete projects that otherwise would not have been possible, but should not be mistaken for ongoing revenue.

In keeping with our responsibility to be good stewards of taxpayer funds, we will continue to actively seek out potentially available funding to offset costs when possible.

I am pleased to submit the FY-2024 budget for consideration and review. There are a lot of positive things happening in Hannibal, including progress on the demolition of derelict buildings, and the first year of the sales tax infrastructure funding to remedy some of the failing infrastructure over the next few years. I believe in this community and am proud to be a part of the staff.

I wish to have an open conversation in regards to raising funds to cover the 10% pay increase asked for by our police and fire departments.

In our budget meeting. The mayor states "that our people are our greatest resources". I believe that we can all agree with that statement. Our city manager, who has found us millions of dollars in grant money to fix things like Union Street and North Street. She went toe to toe with the Army Corp of Engineers and won and saved the city hundreds of thousands of dollars for rebuilding the pumps for our downtown flood control system. In our budget meeting, she stated to the 10% asked by police and fire was to "find me the money". I trust our city manager who possesses a Masters degree in Public Policy and Administration to present us a balanced budget of which she did. We (councilmen looked though the lines and the only thing we could find to easily cut was the city wide pick up that won't fill the gap for the 10% increase.

I also heard rumblings that the council has kicked the can down the street for too long. That we need to do something to increase revenues. Our sales tax rate is presently 8.86% so I don't see that as an option. This leaves us with property taxes that have not been increased since 1973. Yes 50 years ago is when property taxes increased last. I checked with the county collector and the amount collected for 2022 real estate taxes for the city of Hannibal was \$2,012,836. The amount collected by the county for the city of Hannibal for Personal Property was \$606,368. If we proposed to the voters a 10% increase in real and personal property we would raise \$262,120 which would more than bridge the gap from the proposed increase for police and fire from 6% to 10%. So voters are going to say "how does that affect me and what I pay?". I consider myself average and looking at my own property taxes, just for the line that says "Hannibal City" my taxes on a 1400 square foot home would increase by \$26.49. My personal property would increase \$15.09. This would affect my tax bill \$41.58 a year. For me, a small increase to support and retain good firefighters and police officers. Going back to 1973, the minimum wage was \$1.60 an hour, even adjusted for inflation it is \$5.65 an hour. Todays minimum wage in Missouri is \$12.00 an hour. We couldn't live on 1973 wages, but somehow we are expecting Hannibal to survive on 1973 wages.....

I would hope that we could get support from the Chiefs of these two departments. If they are as passionate at service club presentations as they were at the budget workshop they should be able to convince those people to vote to support them. It would be a great opportunity for the fire department union members contact voters door to door, first to see if a working smoke

detector is in the home and second to educate the public on how they can support them. For the police department union members it would be a great opportunity to listen to people that have problems in their neighborhoods and then to educate them on a way that their department cab be helped.

MEMO Proposal to Promote Transparency and Accountability with Monthly City Manager's Report

TO: Hannibal City Council

For the 9th time in 9 meetings, we are asking Council to update the ordinances to require a monthly report from the City Manager to our citizens and businesses in our Public Council Meetings.

As members of City Council, we work for our citizens who elects us. Our citizens would be better able to offer feedback on our performance if they received a monthly update on the happenings in Hannibal's Government. The City Manager Reports would create a better-informed City Council. A better-informed City Council should result in an even more effective working relationship with the City Manager in achieving the goals we as a Council ought to be setting for the City in response to the feedback from the citizens.

Such reports are a commonplace best practice in governments, businesses, and everything in between both in Hannibal and across the world.

In service to misunderstandings we've recently been made ware of, a presentation from the City Manager would NOT be a line by line recitation. It would instead be sharing the highlights the City Manager deems most appropriate. We envision this to be similar to presentations from the HBPW GM to his board or the HREDC Director to their board.

A requirement that the City Manager must present their report to the public in Public City Council meetings would add roughly ten minutes once a month in our estimation. In fact, as a result of hearing such a report, both Council and the Public would be better informed and any time added would likely save time in other areas. Plus, since we ask our employees to go above in and beyond in their service to our constitutes the least we as Council can do is give ten minutes more of our time once a month.

In a recent Facebook post Mayor Pro tem Dobson asked what could be more transparent than posting the report on the website? Our answer is the same as it has been for seven consecutive meetings: Update the ordinances to require a monthly report from the City Manager to the City Council and to the citizens for whom we serve in our open and Public Council Meetings.

TO: Hannibal City Council

Our Police and Firefighters are understaffed, underpaid, and deserve a Ten Percent raise.

According to both Chiefs, training expenses related to turnover as well as overtime expenses are steeply increasing.

Per staff, Hannibal would likely be able to afford a Ten Percent raise in the next budget year. BUT we owe it to HFD and HPD who serve all of us, not to mention the City we are meant serve as Council, to think beyond the next budget year.

We propose putting a 1/2 cent Public Safety Sales Tax on the ballot for voter approval to create a <u>dedicated</u> funding source for the Hannibal Police and Fire Departments. If passed, proceeds could only be used on HPD and HFD. Public Safety Taxes are used in the smallest towns and biggest cities all across Missouri.

A Ten Percent raise will also make salaries more competitive with surrounding areas. This will also reduce turnover and training expenses + stabilize staff reducing overtime expenses. Current staffing levels at HPD mean that Policemen are working unsustainable levels of overtime just to keep our streets patrolled, keeping our sworn officers away from home and their families.

Our Firefighters and Police Officers protect us and now it's our responsibility to protect their budgets for the foreseeable future.

This is a long term problem that deserves a long term solution. Any incremental property tax increase is a short term bandaid. That being said, we accept that on this topic there is more than one correct solution, we believe this proposal to be best for now and the future. Please read on for more details.

AN ORDINANCE REVISING CHAPTER 2 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HANNIBAL BY REVOKING AND ENACTING IN IT'S PLACE A NEW CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE III – CITY COUNCIL, DIVISION 2, RULES AND ORDER OF BUSINESS, SECTION 2-172

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Hannibal:

Section 1. WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that in order to encourage transparence and to provide information to the general public that it is appropriate for a report of the City Manager to be a part of the public record;

AND WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that they wish to add a provision for a report by the City Manager during the one regularly scheduled meeting per month of the City Council of the City of Hannibal;

NOW THEREFORE, the City Council makes the following amendments to Chapter 2 of the ordinances of the City of Hannibal:

Section 2. CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE III – City Council, Division 2, Rules and Order of Business, Section 2-172 is hereby revoked and replaced as follows:

Sec. 2-172. - Order of business; call to order.

At the hour appointed for the meeting, the clerk or someone appointed to serve in his absence shall proceed to call the roll of members, marking the absentees, and announce whether a quorum is present. Upon the appearance of the quorum, the council shall be called to order by the mayor, if present. If the mayor is absent, the meeting shall be called to order by the mayor pro tempore. If both are absent, the council shall elect a temporary chairman. The council may then proceed to do the business before it. The order of business shall be as follows:

- (1) Roll call.
- (2) Call to order.
- (3) Invocation.
