
Re: Acquire City Property-Railroad Right of Way

Date: August 28, 2019

Mr. Scott Gollaher, resident at 2935 Market Street and Mr. Nickolas Reeves, resident at 2835 Market Street approached Council requesting to purchase pieces of property of abandoned railroad right-of way (ROW) This property was formally the old 29th Street that was supposed to be given to the property owners by the former Building Inspector, John Wealer, but the process was never completed.

During the council meeting that Mr. Reeves and Mr. Gollaher asked to speak at, it was indicated that the City has deeded off bits and pieces of this railroad ROW over the course of time. Per the City Attorney, some of these exchanges predates him so there hasn't always been a consistently on the handling of the property. In the past, the City would charge a nominal fee and the property owner would obtain a legal description and the City would then provide a quit claim deed, if they are the owners of the adjoining property. City Attorney Lemon indicated he doesn't feel that a title company would insure the property in question without a quiet title suite, which is a minimal fee of \$1000.00. Therefore, the City in the past has given the quit claim deeds and not a fee simple title. While this would "clean it up' it is a very expensive process and as a result the railroad ground has very little marketable value.

It was suggested that both Mr. Reeves and Mr. Gollaher provide a legal description from a surveyor and the City provides a quit claim deed. This type of deed states the City is unsure if they own it, however, if they do, the deed holder is entitled to it. Mr. Reeves and Mr. Gollaher are both willing to undergo the cost of the surveying for the property.

Dear Mayor Hark and Hannibal City Council Members:

Hannibal Free Public Library acquires books and other materials utilizing funds provided by taxpayers and through other means. The Library checks out and circulates materials to our patrons. In FY2018-2019, we circulated 83,354 items to 8,962 registered borrowers (patrons). Most of the time, materials are returned on time in the same condition as borrowed.

The problem before you today concerns materials that are not returned, are returned damaged or mutilated, or are removed from the Library building without permission. State Statute defines these situations as library theft. Most library theft in Hannibal results from failure to return borrowed materials, and the amount owed often falls below the State's felony threshold. The Library goal is to have materials returned in the condition borrowed. If this is not possible, our goal is to have the borrower pay for the materials at their replacement cost.

The Library has used the services of a collection agency for a number of years. In 2018 and to date in 2019, we referred 78 accounts to the collection agency, 69 of which are still outstanding. These current outstanding accounts represent \$8,114.90 in stolen library books and other materials. These accounts include 9 people who owe over \$150.00. One of these people owes \$945.00, one owes \$717.00, and a third owes \$440.00. It seems clear to me that the collection agency is not able to accomplish getting all our materials returned or paid for although the collection agency is quite effective with many patrons. We need a City Ordinance to make it possible to prosecute in Municipal Court.

The Library truly appreciates the support of the City. Adoption of this ordinance is one more way the City will show its support. Thank you.

Re: Street Sweeping Refuse Collection

Date: August 22, 2019

The Department of Public Works recently opened bids for the 2019-2020 Street Sweeping Refuse Collection. Due to Missouri Department of Natural Resources mandates, all materials collected from the Street Sweeper must be sent to a sanitary landfill.

We received two bids for this service:

Area Disposal Services: \$75.00/Ton Republic Services: \$113.00/Ton

At this point we are unsure how many tons of materials we will need hauled in one year. A lot of factors effect this including flooding, bad winters and equipment failure. We do have a very large stockpile of street sweeping material that we have been storing for a few months, so this first year number will most likely be skewed from future years.

The City budgeted \$40,000 in the FY 2019-2020 budget for street sweeping material hauling.

The Department of Public Works recommends award of the contract to Area Disposal Services, for \$75/ton for the Street Sweeping Refuse Collection for the 2019-2020 season.

The Hannibal Regional Airport would like to enter into an Aviation Fuel Contract with Titan Aviation Fuels to become a branded Shell Aviation FBO.

As part of the contract we would exclusively purchase all aviation fuel from Titan Aviation.

As part of the contract our airport will be allowed to opt into \$50,000,000 excess aviation refueling liability insurance free of charge. We will also be working with Titan Aviation and Shell Aviation on set fueling operations including inspections, maintenance etc....

Having the stability and expertise of Titan Aviation and Shell Aviation as our fuel supplier gives us significant comfort in our Airport Operations. In addition Titan Aviation/Shell Aviation is the supplier of fuel for the Quincy Airport.

The Department of Public Works recommends that the City Council authorize the Mayor to sign a three year Aviation Fuels Contract with Titan Aviation Fuels to supply Jet A and Aviation Gas 100LL to the Hannibal Regional Airport.
