Re: Parks Ordinance

A situation was raised with me regarding camping in our Park System, what rules applied etc. A review of our ordinances and a discussion with Andy led me to the conclusion that there were in fact no rules.

At the current time we do not have camping areas designated in the Park system. As a result it would make sense that we would not allow camping at this time. However, it also appears to me that we may at some future date designate camping areas as our park system expands.

As a result of the foregoing, I have drafted the attached ordinance which would establish the general rules and also establish a framework for the Parks Department to govern camping in the future.

TO: Hannibal City Council

I propose that we seek out a firm to conduct annual Leadership 360 surveys + coaching in perpetuity for those employees who directly report to City Council: the City Clerk and City Manager.

The Clerk and Manager should also be empowered with the authority to implement this vital continuing education tool with their own employees as they see fit.

A Leadership 360 survey is an anonymous survey where leaders receive feedback from their colleagues and subordinates on their skills, effectiveness, behaviors, etc. After the results are compiled the City Council will get the results and the above will receive private coaching from a certified professional.

As part time elected representatives with other full time jobs there is a restriction on how much we as Councilpeople can learn about our own government. Additionally, often times there are "fires" to put out which make it difficult to focus on the long term. In other words, the urgent can crowd out the important. Using Leadership 360 surveys on an annual basis helps to address both of these limiting factors.

In a town/region such as ours, where our pool of employees is smaller and attracting outside talent is challenging, there is an even greater urgency to learn from ourselves. Conducting annual Leadership 360 surveys is a step towards further building a system where continuous improvement is a core value.

TO: Hannibal City Council

I propose that we use our existing HR Counsel, Jackson Lewis to conduct exit interviews with our employees in perpetuity until/if we hire a dedicated HR Administrator.

Each exiting employee should receive a written questionnaire. For those who are full-time (read: not seasonal) a followup oral interview is appropriate. Other measures can be taken on an as needed basis as determined by HR counsel.

Using an independent 3rd party to conduct exit interviews assures unbiased anonymity and that appropriate information will reach City Council as needed. Additionally, outsourcing this service will reduce the work burden internally allowing staff to concentrate on their areas of expertise.

In a town/region such as ours, where our pool of employees is smaller and attracting outside talent is challenging, there is an even greater urgency to learn from ourselves. Using professional third party services for exit interviews is a step towards further building a system where continuous improvement is a core value.

RE: Viking Dock Modification

In recent discussion with Viking Cruise Lines they have made a request that we make a modification to the Southern Dock in order to better accommodate their cruise ship. The need for the modification is due to the Viking Ships having an entrance to their ship further from the bow then the other cruise ships.

The modifications would include pulling the dock spud poles and re-locating the current dock approximately 50 feet south of where it is now. Contractors would then set the poles back in place. Additional work would include a new Deadman to tie up to and a new landing pad for the gangway.

Klingner & Associates has provided us and hourly contract up to \$8,600 for the design, bidding and construction administration for this project.

In discussions with Viking they have agreed to cover the cost of the project in addition to the City utilizing the \$50,000 Viking gave the City for dock work as part of the original contract agreement. The City has not used this money yet as it was specifically set aside for any future dock repairs or modifications such as this.

The Parks and Recreation Department recommends that the City Council authorize the Mayor to sign an engineering service agreement with Klingner & Associates for the hourly contract not to exceed \$8,600 for the modification to the South Riverfront Dock.
