#### CALL TO ORDER

It being the appointed time, Mayor Hark opened the 6:30 p.m. Public Hearing, relating to the rezoning of property located in the Houck addition, second revision.

He then turned the Public Hearing over to Edie Graupman, DPW Management Assistant.

## EDIE GRAUPMAN – DPW MGMT ASSISTANT Re: Rezoning – Lot 5 in Houck Addition, Second Revision A-One & Two Family to B-Multiple Family

Koontz Properties, LLC

Graupman advised that the City received a rezoning application from Koontz Property, LLC. This request is to rezone property located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Munger Lane and Stardust Drive. This property is legally described as Lot 5 of the Houck Addition, second revision, and is currently owned by Girard and James and Jennifer Secker Trust. The request is to have the property rezoned from A-One & Two Family to B-Multiple Family.

This request went before the Planning & Zoning Commission on January 21, 2021, which was done as a virtual meeting, as the City isn't meeting in public. Notices were sent to residences within 185 feet of the property and the hearing notice was advertised in the newspaper and included the zoom information, so the public could attend if desired. The Commission received one (1) positive comment and one (1) negative comment in relation to the request. The Planning & Zoning Commission approved giving a positive recommendation to move forward to present the request to City Council. The purchase of this property, by Koontz Properties, LLC, is contingent upon the approval to rezone the property. If it's not rezoned the buyer does not plan to proceed with purchasing from the Secker Trust.

Mayor Pro Tem Dobson advised Council that his first question, as a Commissioner on the Planning & Zoning Commission, related to the development of the property, and if it would be government funded or privately developed, which he was advised it would be a private development. Graupman advised this project would be a \$5 million investment for the City of Hannibal.

They Mayor then asked for anyone who wished to speak for or against the rezoning to come forward, with there being none.

### LISA PECK – CITY MANAGER Re: North Street Flood Protection Project – Authorization for Entry

US Army Corps of Engineers (Resolution No. 2315-21, to follow)

City Manager Lisa Peck advised a Resolution will follow which will authorize the Army Corps of Engineers to access City property located on North Street, where the road and storm sewer was damaged as a result of the 2019 flood. This access will allow the Corps to repair their portion, which is from the "toe" of the levy to the alley area. The other damaged areas will be funded by FEMA.

Mayor Pro Tem Dobson questioned which alley Peck was referring to, in which she advised it's the alley directly behind Mark Twain Brewery.

#### ANGELICA ZERBONIA – CITY CLERK

Re: Approval, Declaration, Disposal & Donation of Surplus Property

Miscellaneous Telephone Equipment

City Clerk Zerbonia advised she is requesting approval to declare, dispose of and donate surplus telephone property. She reminded Council, with the recently approved City wide voice over IP

system in place, these old phones are no longer needed. There have been 22 phones identified, 17 Toshiba and five (5) NEC brands, she is requesting surplus declaration of.

These phones, which were in City Hall offices and the Fire Department, have no monetary value and would be disposed of. We determined this by contacting another City that utilizes the Toshiba phones to check for interest and were advised they had none, even if we were to give to them. However, Chief Benjamin advised Zerbonia that St. John's Church/School has expressed an interest in obtaining the five (5) NEC brand phones, for parts, as they have the same, aging phones and difficulty obtaining replacement parts.

Zerbonia is requesting to declare 17 Toshiba and five (5) NEC phones as surplus property, with the NEC phones to be given to St. John's Church/School, for parts, with the Toshiba phones being disposed of.

A motion was made by Council Member Veach to approve the declaration of 22 phones as surplus property with 17 Toshiba phones being destroyed and five (5) NEC brands being donated to St. John's Church/School. The motion was seconded by Council Member Welch.

#### MIKE BENJAMIN – FIRE CHIEF Re: Implementation & Establishment, Mitigation Program

Emergency and Non-Emergency Deployment & Services (Bill No. 21-002, to follow)

Mike Benjamin, Fire Chief, approached Council advising he is requesting approval for an Ordinance for cost recovery on non-residential calls for vehicle accidents, fires or calls outs. This is a similar process that is currently used by the department for HazMat spills. These charges would cover equipment, supplies and personnel deployed to emergency and non-emergency scenes. The department has been researching this model for several months, and had also looked at it several years ago. However, costs continue to rise and the department must look at ways to recoup costs. Chief Benjamin has checked with other cities and insurance companies and this is common practice that they are familiar with.

Mayor Pro Tem Dobson asked if they were looking to use Recovery, USA for billing services, in which Benjamin advised the service would have to be let for bids. Mayor Pro Tem Dobson indicated he believes that Recovery, USA is the only company that collects these "fees" for fire departments and they even have a sample Ordinance on their website. Chief Benjamin has been working with City Attorney, James Lemon and his office, on preparing the Ordinance being presented this evening and are comfortable with it. Mayor Pro Tem Dobson believes the company keeps 20% of the fees recovered and it only takes 5-10 minutes to complete and submit a report. Council Member Codgal questioned if there would be a set fee amount, in which Deputy Chief Nieson advised fees are task dependent, which will determine the amount charged.

Kenneth & Deanna Taylor – 1805 Hope Street (Resolution No. 2316-21, to follow)

Edie Graupman, DPW Management Assistant, approached Council with two items. She advised her first item is acceptance of donated property from Kenneth and Deanna Taylor which is located at 1805 Hope Street. In 2020, this property suffered extensive fire damage and the property owners cannot afford to complete the repairs. The City has agreed to demolish the home and in lieu of the liens, the City would accept the property as a donation. The City has also received a check from the Taylor's insurance company to help offset the expenses incurred for the demolition.
