# JAMES LEMON – CITY ATTORNEY

Re: Abandoned C. B. & Q. Railroad & Old 29th Street Right-of-Way - Quit Claim Deeds Scott & Brandy Gollaher (Resolution No. 2227-19, to follow) Nickolas Reeves (Resolution No. 2228-19, to follow)

City Attorney James Lemon then addressed Council relating to the transfer of Right-of-Way property where Council directed him to prepare quit claim deeds for Scott and Brandy Gollaher

and Nickolas Reeves. Both deeds are on the agenda this evening for approval, with accompanying Resolutions. This property is located on/near Market Street and the former 29<sup>th</sup> Street, adjacent to Gollaher & Reeves existing property. This was brought forth originally by the Gollaher's and Reeves' request to acquire these properties.

City Attorney Lemon stated Resolutions No. 2227-19 and 2228-19 are to follow, for approval.

### HALLIE YUNDT – SILVER – LIBRARIAN, HANNIBAL PUBLIC LIBRARY Re: Code Amendment, Chapter 16, Section 16, Article VII, OFFENSES AGAINST GOVERNMENT - SEC. 16-238. Library theft, guilty of stealing (Bill No. 19-021, to follow)

Hallie Yundt-Silver, Librarian, approached Council relating to an Ordinance addressing patrons who do not return items, nor pay for the costs of damaged items, late or failure to return, even after referred to a collection agency. There are other patrons that walk out of the building without checking out the materials and others that feel they can deliberately deface or tear up library property, which are not children. She feels this is a very unfortunate action to have to take but necessary for the Library.

City Attorney James Lemon advised he and Hallie together worked on this Ordinance, which does match the state statute fairly close. Hallie stated, with the approval of this Ordinance, it would allow the City Attorney to prosecute offenders in Municipal Court instead of processing them through the Prosecuting Attorney and a higher court.

Mayor Pro Tem Dobson then questioned the cost of some delinquent bills and if those individuals are still allowed to check books out, in which Hallie advised individuals are not allowed to check out materials from the Library if they are delinquent or have any amount owed. They are also not allowed to use the downloadable resources until the item is returned or fines paid in full.

Mayor Hark stated Bill No. 19-021 is to follow, for a first reading.

### ANDY DORIAN – DIRECTOR, CENTRAL SERVICES Re: Street Sweeping Refuse Collections – Contract Agreement Area Disposal Services - \$75/Ton (Resolution No. 2226-19, to follow)

Andy Dorian, Director of Central Services, then approached Council advising the Street Department recently let bids for the refuse collection of street sweeping materials. It is mandated by Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR), that all materials collected by the street sweeper must be taken to a sanitary landfill. Dorian stated bids were opened with two being received:

Area Disposal Services: \$75.00/Ton Republic Services: \$113.00/Ton

Dorian advised currently there is quite a large "stock pile" that needs to be removed and the City has budgeted \$40,000 for this project for fiscal year 2019-2020.

Mayor Hark stated Resolution No. 2226-19 is to follow, for approval.

Council Member Bowen then asked how much per month is picked up by the sweeper, in which Dorian advised it is dependent upon the weather and other factors, although the biggest amount is usually after winter from cleaning the salt off the streets. Dorian advised he and City Clerk Zerbonia have been working on GPS devices for all the Street and Parks Department vehicles and one will be being placed on the street sweeper. This will assist with necessary DNR reporting as well. Council Member Welch then asked if it would be an option to provide the information from the GPS devices to the public, in which Dorian and Zerbonia advised, not at this time, it is only available to the administrators of the account. This will however, be able to report to the public the location, dates and times whether street sweeping or snow removal. Mayor Pro Tem Dobson reminded Council the HPD patrol cars have GPS devices on them and they, along with 911, have been very happy with the results. Council Member Cogdal then questioned the schedule of the street sweeper, in which Dorian stated it will follow the Ward schedule, like last year, unless an issue arises. Dorian did explain that when the Street Department is "heavy into paving", which requires all staff, the sweeper will probably not be in use.

### **Re:** Airport Aviation Fuels – Aviation Fuels Contract

Eastern Aviation Fuels, Inc., DBA: Titan Aviation Fuels/Shell Aviation (Resolution No. 2229-19, to follow)

On Dorian's next item of business, he advised he has been working with Titan Aviation Fuels which is a Shell branded aviation distributor for jet fuel. They have been working on a contract which would allow the airport to become Shell branded. This would mean the Hannibal Airport would exclusively buy only from Shell Aviation and would have the ability to obtain a fifty million dollar insurance policy. This company would also provide a significant amount of training for the fuel systems. Dorian stated that Quincy also receives their fuel from Titan Aviation, which makes them Shell branded and he hopes in the future this will allow some sort of partnership between the two airports.

Mayor Hark stated Resolution No. 2229-19 is to follow, for approval.

### GAIL BRYANT – DIRECTOR, HANNIBAL CONVENTION & VISITORS BUREAU Re: Welcome Center Affiliate Signage – Supplemental Guide Sign Program Participant Contract

Missouri Logos, Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MHTC) & Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) - \$8,280 (Resolution No. 2223-19, to follow)

Gail Bryant, Director of the Hannibal Convention & Visitor's Bureau (HCVB), addressed Council relating to two items. She stated with the new HCVB building project progressing far enough along where signage is needed, she is requesting Council approval for the City to submit an application, along with payment to Missouri Logos to begin the process for the approved signage to be located on the highway and interstate. In December 2017, HCVB completed an application, with Council approval, to become an affiliate Welcome Center, which allows them to have signage on the interstate. There will be four signs, one in Illinois and three in Missouri. This issue has also been approved by the HCVB Board for a one-time payment of \$8,280.00, with annual renewal fees of \$920.00.

Mayor Pro Tem Dobson then asked Bryant if she would be placing any signage on Highway 61, being as it's so close proximity, in which Bryant advised not at this time, as the Missouri Welcome Center is located on Highway 61.

Bryant stated Resolution No. 2223-19 is to follow, for approval.

### **Re: Welcome Center Internet Service – Service Order & Customer Declaration** *Blue Bird Network*

(Resolution No. 2224-19, to follow)

Bryant's second item is also for the new HCVB Welcome Center. This is for an internet provider, in which she is requesting approval for the Mayor to enter into a three year lease with Blue Bird Network. This service is already on site and the Aquatic Center uses Blue Bird Network, which also happens to the lowest cost provider compared to Chariton Valley and Spectrum.

Mayor Pro Tem Dobson questioned if it would be fiber optic, in which Bryant concurred. Council Member Bowen then questioned how fast Blue Bird Network was compared to Charter, Bryant advised she was not sure, that the company was recommended by Matthew Jones from the Board of Public Works (BPW).

Bryant stated Resolution No. 2224-19 is to follow, for approval.

# COREY MEHAFFY – HANNIBAL REGIONAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

## **Re: B&B Theaters Operating Company, Inc. – Cooperative Development Agreement** (*Resolution No. 2225-19, to follow*)

Corey MeHaffy, representing the Hannibal Regional Economic Development Council, approached Council relating to a Resolution to approve and authorize the Mayor to execute a cooperative development agreement with B&B Theaters. Mehaffy explained there is exciting new reinvestment going on in downtown Hannibal, not just new investment but reinvestment by many of the businesses, such as the theater.

Mehaffy stated Resolution No. 2225-19 is to follow, for approval.

He also wanted to remind everyone of some of the things going on with the project, such as reclining seating, a new bar being installed, new interior signs, along with seating for 4D viewing. This means Hannibal is the only rural area with this type of seating. This will hopefully produce more sales tax revenue, additional property taxes and improvement for the quality of life. It was originally discussed with the Council an opportunity to establish a base line of sales tax dollars, which would be paid or given to the City each year based on 2018 collections, anything above that would be split 50/50 with the theater company and is defined in the agreement.

Mehaffy stated there are a couple of changes from the original draft, such as the agreement was originally presented as an Ordinance, but has now been presented as a Resolution. Other changes included the base line job requirements went from eight full time equivalent employees to seven, language was changed to include both capital investment on B&B's behalf in terms of capital as well as any leasing of equipment they will be using. The total investment was changed to \$1.7 million dollars for the overall project. One item that was requested by the B&B Theaters Company, which was not opposed by Council, was if the City fails to appropriate for any given year, the term length of the agreement would be extended for another year. Also any transference of this agreement would require approval, in writing by the City. A calculator was added for liquidated damages, which means, if for any reason B&B Theaters fall below the base line of employment that was discussed, B&B Theaters will pay \$250 per full time equivalent employee.
