

SUBJECT: CODE AMENDMENT – SECTION 26 SIGNS

The HHMC has proposed an amended ordinance in relationship to A-frame signs permitted in the E-1 and H-1 zones. The new ordinance removes the May through October limitation and allows signs on the sidewalks year-round. The merchants feel the need to have advertising for their business year-round. This simple compromise is acceptable to both the HHMC and the HDDC with the HDDC being represented by Kristy Trevathan at the meetings. I am presenting to you the old ordinance and the proposal for its replacement.

Present Ordinance:

Sec. 26-8. - A-frame signs.

A-frame-type signs, sandwich signs, may be allowed continuously within the E-1 and H-1 zones during the months of May through October. Such signs must conform to the guidelines established for each zoning district; provided, however, that in no event shall such signs exceed 20 square feet in total sign area or four feet by $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet per side in dimension.

(Code 1963, § 268.130; Code 1988, § 26-7(3); Ord. No. 3376, § 2, 2-7-1984; Ord. No. 3779, § 2, 3-17-1992)

Proposed new Ordinance:

Sec. 26-8. - A-frame signs.

A-frame-type signs, sandwich signs, may be allowed year round within the E-1 and H-1 zones under the following limitations.

- (1) Such signs must conform to the guidelines established for each zoning district.
- (2) Total size of the portable sign may not exceed 20 square feet, the maximum dimension of the sign shall not exceed four feet by $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- Obstruction of the sidewalk to pedestrian traffic shall not be permitted, except as allowed (3) by the city sidewalk regulations.
- (4)
- There shall be no visual obstruction to motorists on adjacent streets.

 Signs shall be removed from the sidewalk at the end of each business day. (5)
- (6) Only one sign allowed per building.

Re: Engineering RFQ re: City Hall HVAC

I am requesting permission to issue an RFQ for engineering/architectural design to remedy the HVAC issues at City Hall. The boiler is oversized due to the removal of many of the radiators and the introduction of a combination of some window unit heating and cooling and some force air heating and cooling for some of the offices. The current systems experience frequent replacements and are unreliable.

REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES

The City of Hannibal, Missouri, requests qualifications for engineering/architectural design, bidding, and construction services to assist in an HVAC and window replacement project at its City Hall located at 320 Broadway. The City Hall building was built in the early 1900s and currently has a partial boiler system and a partial forced ventilation system. The project currently contemplated by the City includes replacement of the existing HVAC system and replacement of exterior windows throughout the building. Funding for the project may utilize ARPA funds, city funds, or other grant funds.

Information provided to the City must include:

- a) The specialized experience and technical competence of the firm with respect to HVAC system improvements and window replacements, or related work;
- b) The capacity and capability of the firm to perform the work in questions, including specialized services, within a period of twelve to eighteen months;
- c) The past record of performance of the firm with respect to such factors as control of costs, quality of work, and ability to meet schedules;
- d) The firm's proximity to and familiarity with the area in which the project is located; and
- e) References from previous clients of related work with the firm within the past five years.

The firm will be selected based on the above qualifications. Once the most qualified firm is selected, a cost for the required engineering services will be negotiated.

The ability to begin work immediately plus (c) above shall receive primary consideration. Solicitations from WBE/MBE firms are invited and encouraged.

Responses shall be submitted in writing (six copies), in a sealed envelope, delivered to the Office of the City Clerk, City Hall, 320 Broadway, Hannibal, Missouri, 63401, with the outside of the envelope clearly marked "STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS – CITY HALL HVAC". The City reserves the right to reject responses it receives after <u>4:00 PM on April 7, 2022</u>. The City will open and review the responses and review them at a time convenient for City personnel. Re: Changes to Traffic Committee

There have been changes since this ordinance was enacted, making it outdated. The new ordinance corresponds to current staffing positions, removes some burdensome language regarding individual members collecting data on accidents (a function of the police department), and removing the semiannual report. This language also allows the Director of Central Services to issue Handicapped Parking Permits that meet the criteria for such.
