
All vacancies in the council, except as otherwise provided herein, shall be filled by the council, upon its majority vote, for a period running to the next regular

municipal election, at which time a successor shall be elected for the unexpired term of such vacant office. In the case of a ward councilman, such successor for such interim term shall be a resident of the ward where the vacancy in representation exists. Where a vacancy in the council occurs more than twelve (12) months next preceding a regular municipal election, the council shall within two (2) weeks, call a special election in the ward or wards affected for the election of a councilman for the unexpired term, for each such vacant office in the council, which election shall be held at the next regular election date specified by state law.

CITY OF HANNIBAL SEEKS INTERESTED CITIZENS FOR FIFTH WARD COUNCIL MEMBER

The City of Hannibal is calling for all interested citizens of the Fifth Ward, who wish to serve in the vacant position of Fifth Ward Council Member, to deliver to the Office of City Clerk a letter of interest no later than 10:00 a.m. Tuesday February 25, 2025.

Minimum requirements/qualifications that must be met include:

- at least twenty-five (25) years of age
- · citizen of the United States
- registered voter of the City
- inhabitant of the City for at least one (1) year
- resident of the Sixth Ward for at least six (6) months proceeding
- no person shall be entitled to hold any office who is in arrears for any City taxes

Council Members cannot hold any other compensated public office, or any position in City government during the term of Council Member. See the City of Hannibal Charter at www.hannibal-mo.gov for additional limitations and qualifications.

This position will be appointed by vote of the City Council and will serve for a temporary period ending with the next Municipal Election in April 2026 and requires attendance of bi-weekly Council meetings. Compensation is \$200 per month and has no fringe benefits with the exception of election to participate in Missouri Local Government Employees Retirement System (LAGERS).

Interested persons should submit a letter of interest explaining qualifications and desire to represent the City of Hannibal and Fifth Ward as Council Member and include name, address and phone number. This letter will be used to determine who will be allowed to participate in a subsequent interview with the City Council, based on verification of the above qualifications. The letter of interest must be submitted to the Office of City Clerk by 10:00 a.m. February 25th, 2025, to qualify.



The Department of Public Works recently went out for bid for the sale of city owned property at 419 North 7^{th} .

We received four bids with Andrew and Megan Conkright submitting the high bid of \$1,500.

A title report was completed showing no deed restrictions or liens.

In addition, the following covenants will be placed on the property.

COVENANTS AND RESTRICTIONS

- 1. The property shall be kept maintained in accordance with the requirements of applicable laws and ordinances. The property shall be kept mowed at a minimum to the standards established by ordinance. Any structures on the home shall be maintained in such a manner as to comply with all applicable ordinances, and under no circumstances shall they be allowed to reach the status of a common law public nuisance or a nuisance in violation of Hannibal City Ordinances.
- 2. The property shall be utilized on in accordance with the laws of the State of Missouri and the zoning ordinances of the City of Hannibal. No unlawful uses shall be allowed.

- 3. All taxes on the property, including federal, state, county or city shall be kept paid and current at all times.
- 4. These covenants and restrictions shall touch and concern the land, and shall be binding upon all subsequent title holders.



Subject: Ordinance Change - Fire Department Age Requirements

I am proposing to change the existing ordinance regarding the age requirements for joining the fire department to not less than 18 years old or but not yet reached their 40th birthday. Current age limitations may restrict candidates from pursuing a career in the fire service, and adjusting these guidelines could enhance our recruiting efforts.

The current ordinance mandates that all applicants to the fire department must be 21-year-old but not yet reached their 36th birthday. While this age restriction was initially established to ensure physical fitness and readiness, it may unintentionally exclude capable and motivated candidates who possess the necessary experience and training, particularly those who have pursued different career paths before seeking to join the fire service. By lowering the starting age, we have an opportunity to recruit candidates before they get established in the work force in a different career. Raising the starting age allows us to recruit candidates who have been in the work force and looking for a career change or military retirees who are looking for a second career.

WHEREAS the City Council previously passed an ordinance setting certain age restrictions at the time of hire for employees of the fire department, and

WHEREAS, the Council has become aware that they are limited in locating qualified applicants for the fire department who are within the age range, and it is necessary to extend those parameters in order to expand the pool of qualified applicants.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HANNIBAL, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE: The City Council hereby revokes existing Section 12-23 and enacts the following Section 12-23:

Sec. 12 -23. - Qualifications of members.

Each person appointed as a member of the fire department shall have the following qualifications:

- (1) Shall be a high school graduate or an acceptable equivalent thereof and shall be of good moral character.
- (2) Shall be in good physical condition and pass a medical examination as established by the city or its designated official, board, agency, or commission. Such examination is given by a designated physician.
- (3) Must possess a valid operator's or chauffeur's license.
- (4) Shall successfully pass the written, oral, physical ability and other tests as prescribed by the fire chief.
- (5) Must not be less than 18 years of age or have reached their 40th birthday at the time of hiring. If the person has previously been employed by the department and has voluntarily terminated their employment while in good standing with the department, the age restriction shall be waived if the person is rehired for employment within one year of said voluntary termination.

In December of 2023, the Hannibal Fire Department applied for a grant through the FY 2024 American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) First Responder Equipment Grant (FREG) to purchase 2 new support vehicles. We were awarded \$82,300 to purchase the 2 support vehicles. As a condition of the award, the city would be required to contribute a cost match up to \$82,300, or 50% of the total approved project cost of \$164,600.

In the fall of 2024, we received the following 2 bids.

Don Brown Chevrolet/Public Safety Upfitters

\$130,364.00

Karl Automotive

\$138, 792.02

Our cost match of 50% would be \$65,182.00 for two 2025 Chevrolet Tahoes equipped with emergency lighting, siren, and radio equipment. The Missouri Department of Public Safety has given us approval to move forward with the acceptance of the low bid.

I am asking for the council's approval to authorize the mayor to sign the attached agreement.


