



- 2) Sponsor shall purchase and maintain the following insurance, at Sponsor's expense: Commercial General Liability Insurance with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000 each occurrence / \$2,000,000 general aggregate written on an occurrence bases.
Comprehensive Business Automobile Liability Insurance for all owned, non-owned and hired automobiles and other vehicles used by Sponsor with a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 minimum.
Workers Compensation insurance with statutorily limits required by any applicable Federal or state law and Employers Liability insurance with minimum limit of \$1,000,000 per accident.
- 3) All policies of insurance must be on a primary basis, non-contributory with any other insurance and/or self-insurance carried by the City.
- 4) Prior to using City's facilities or infrastructure under this agreement, Sponsor shall furnish the City with certificates of insurance evidencing the required coverage, conditions, and limits required by this agreement, have the City named as an additional insured and provide the appropriate additional insured endorsements.
- 5) No provision of this agreement shall constitute a waiver of the City's right to assert a defense based on the doctrines of sovereign immunity, official immunity, or any other immunity available under law.







**AN ORDINANCE REGARDING RULE OF ORDER AND PROCEDURE PURSUANT

Section 1. WHEREAS, Section 2.12 of the Charter of the city of Hannibal provides that "The council shall determine by ordinance its own rules and order of business.";

AND WHEREAS, further, that the council has determined that it is necessary and appropriate to create certain rules of order regarding agenda items, and the use of City resources to prepare items for the agenda;

NOW THEREFORE, the City Council hereby promulgates the following rules of order which shall govern the operation of the council unless amended by majority vote of the council.

Section 1 Any person wishing to place a matter on the agenda of the regular meeting of the City Council shall submit same to the City Clerk. Such items shall also be submitted to the Mayor for review and approval to add to the agenda. In the event that the requesting person is a councilperson, and the mayor does not approve the request, then any two Councilpersons acting together may direct the City Clerk to place the matter on the meeting Agenda for discussion. In such circumstances, the meeting agenda shall state that the matter is placed on the agenda at the joint request of Councilperson _____ and Councilperson _____.

Section 2. Any Councilperson wishing the City Attorney to draft a resolution, ordinance or other legal document for presentment to the Council as a whole, must first present the matter generally to the council as a whole for vote. The matter shall be voted on and if approved by a majority of the Council, then the City attorney shall be directed to draft the document.

Section 3 All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, in so far as they conflict, are hereby repealed.

Section 4. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

AN ORDINANCE REVISING CHAPTER 7 - BUILDINGS AND BUILDING REGULATIONS, ARTICLE V. - DANGEROUS BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES, SEC. 7-344. - BUILDING COMMISSION CREATED; COMPOSITION, RESPONSIBILITIES

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Hannibal:

Section 1. WHEREAS, the composition of the building commission currently requires the fire chief to serve as a member;

AND WHEREAS, at the request of the fire chief, the council has reviewed the matter and determined that other members of the fire department could be designated by the fire chief to serve in his stead to better make use of staff time;

AND WHEREAS further, Section 7-344 currently requires the building commission to supervise the "city sanitarian", despite the fact that no such position currently exists or is provided for by the ordinances of the City of Hannibal.

NOW THEREFORE, the City Council hereby revises Chapter 7 - Buildings and Building Regulations, Article V. - Dangerous Buildings and Structures, Sec. 7-344. - Building Commission Created; Composition, Responsibilities

Section 1 That Section 7-344 is revoked and a new section 7-344 is created as follows:

Sec 7-344. - Building commission created; composition, responsibilities.

There is hereby created the building commission, which shall be a division of the department of public works. The building commission shall consist of the mayor, the fire chief or his designee, one city employee as appointed by the mayor with approval of the city council, and two councilmen appointed by the mayor with the approval of the council. The building commission shall be charged with the responsibility of enforcing the provisions of this chapter. The building commission shall supervise the building inspector in their inspection responsibilities under this article. It shall be the duty of the building commission to serve the notices as provided in section 7-345 and to hold hearings regarding such buildings or structures.

Section 2 All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, in so far as they conflict, are hereby repealed.

Section 3 That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.



RE: Mobile Food Vendor Ordinance

Staff have been working with the City Engineer and City Attorney to draft an ordinance addressing Mobile Food Vendors and or Food Trucks.

The attached ordinance amends Chapter 15, Article IX of the Ordinances of the City of Hannibal to include a new section 15-353 that addresses mobile food vendors.

The new sections states:

Sec. 15-353 Applicable Zoning

- (a) No mobile food vendor shall operate in any area of the city other than in Zones C, D, E, or F.

15-354 Mobile Food Vendors Licensing

- (a) All persons, merchants, operators, owners, and persons driving and/or selling food items from mobile food vending equipment shall, before selling any item, product, merchandise, or commodity, complete an application for a license or a renewal and pay the required fee as provided in the city's fee schedule, including any investigative fee in the amount as proved in the city's fee schedule for new applicants. Such a mobile food vendor may commence business upon issuance of the license.
- (b) Any operator, owner, or person driving and/or selling food items from mobile food vending equipment shall be required to pay gross receipts on their sales.
- (c) To obtain a business license, the applicant must adhere to the requirements of Chapter 15, Article II – Business Licenses with additional requirements as follows:

- (1) An inspection by the county health department must be completed which indicates the facility and foods served are following all state and local laws.
- (2) Provide proof of a general liability policy, in the name of the business owner, insuring the amount outlined in the city's risk management policy and provide proof of vehicular insurance coverage on units required to be licensed by the state department of revenue.
- (d) Such license shall specifically designate the location of the mobile food vendor's operation and shall in no way authorize or empower the holder thereof to block or impede the flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic upon the public rights of way of the city. It shall be unlawful for any mobile food vendor to operate without the location designated in the license.

Sec. 15-355 Other Mobile Food Vending Requirements

- (a) No mobile food vendor shall operate on city streets in residential areas or impede commercial business by blocking roadways or signage. If directed by a police officer, or any other authorized public personnel, operations may be suspended and a mobile food vendor may be ordered to move, even if located in a mobile food vending zone, to avoid congestion or impeding traffic.
- (b) No mobile food vendor can sell within a city facility.
- (c) No mobile food vendor may offer for sale or display a food item on any public property, including streets and parking lots, unless the mobile food vendor has received permission from City Council as it pertains to a special event. In any case, the mobile food vending equipment shall not be left unattended in a public right of way, nor parked overnight in a public right of way.
- (d) Mobile food vending equipment must be located on an approved hard surface on a property with an active primary business. Parking is not allowed on grass or other landscaped areas.
- (e) Exceptions for mobile food vendors, such as ice cream trucks, shall be allowed to sell merchandise on the public right of way under the following circumstances:
 - (1) The operator does not stop on the public right of way for a period longer than five minutes, and
 - (2) The operator does not impede the flow of traffic.
- (f) The use of outdoor amplifying equipment, lights, or any other illuminated or noisemaking devices is prohibited, except for the lighting of the menu attached to the side of the mobile food vending equipment providing only enough light for customers directly in front of or nearby to the menu to read or the in the ordering area. All signage shall have a professional appearance. Exceptions may be requested and made with City Council approval.
- (g) There shall be no gray water drains coming from the mobile food vending equipment. All gray water must be disposed of properly offsite.
- (h) All mobile food vendors shall have at least one trash receptacle provided for public use immediately adjacent to the mobile food vending equipment. The mobile food

vendor shall contain all refuse generated from the vendor's operation and dispose of grease and trash appropriately.

- (i) All power required for the mobile food vendor equipment shall be self-contained and shall not draw power from the public right of way unless approved by the City Council. The mobile food vendor shall be responsible for containing and maintaining power cords or other power equipment in a safe manner for the public. No power cable or equipment shall be extended at grade or overhead across any public street, alley, or sidewalk.
- (j) All water sources must be approved by the County Health Department and maintained in a safe manner for the public. No water lines or sources of water shall be extended above grade across any public street, alley, or sidewalk. Any water lines or sources of water on private property that are extended above grade must not present a trip hazard and shall be installed in a safe manner.
- (k) All mobile food vendors shall provide access to a restroom or sanitary facility within a reasonable distance for employee use. If there is only one employee, that restroom facility must be adjacent to the mobile food vendor equipment.
- (l) All mobile food vending equipment must be presentable and considered an asset to its location. It must be serviceable and in good repair to promote a positive look and feel.
- (m) Mobile food vending operations are prohibited within one hundred (100) feet from the front door of a restaurant unless the vendor is otherwise provided written consent.
- (n) Mobile food vending operations are prohibited in spaces adjacent to bus stops, disabled loading zones, or directly in front of a business entryway.

Sec. 15-356 Times of Operation Allowed

- (a) Mobile food vending in any permitted area shall be allowed only between the hours of 6:00 AM and 11:00 PM.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Hannibal:

Section 1. WHEREAS, Mobile food vendors or “Food Trucks” have become very popular and the City of Hannibal has no specific ordinances regarding the use of or regulation of same.

AND WHEREAS, further, that the council has determined that it is necessary and appropriate to create ordinances which address the issue of mobile food vendors or “food trucks.

NOW THEREFORE, the City Council hereby revises Chapter 15 Article IX - Miscellaneous Business Regulations as follows:

Section 1 That Chapter 15, Article IX of the Ordinances of the City of Hannibal shall be amended to include a new section 15-351 which shall read as follows:

Sec. 15-351 Definitions

Mobile means any transportable automobile, trailer, container, or equipment that may be used as mobile food vending equipment.

Mobile food vendor means the owner of any mobile food vending equipment and/or any person driving and/or selling food items from the mobile food vending equipment.

Mobile food vending equipment means any automobile, trailer, or other equipment designed and used for cooking, preparation, assembling, and/or serving of a full or limited menu of single service food or beverage items from the vehicle for use by consumers.

Section 2 That Chapter 15, Article IX of the Ordinances of the City of Hannibal shall be amended to include a new section 15-352 which shall read as follows:

Sec. 15-352 Licenses Required

- (a) Applicable motor vehicle license
- (b) Applicable business license

Section 3 That Chapter 15, Article IX of the Ordinances of the City of Hannibal shall be amended to include a new section 15-353 which shall read as follows:

Sec. 15-353 Applicable Zoning

- (a) No mobile food vendor shall operate in any area of the city other than in Zones C, D, E, or F.

Section 4 That Chapter 15, Article IX of the Ordinances of the City of Hannibal shall be amended to include a new section 15-354 which shall read as follows:

15-354 Mobile Food Vendors Licensing

- (a) All persons, merchants, operators, owners, and persons driving and/or selling food items from mobile food vending equipment shall, before selling any item, product, merchandise, or commodity, complete an application for a license or a renewal and pay the required fee as provided in the city's fee schedule, including any investigative fee in the amount as proved in the city's fee schedule for new applicants. Such a mobile food vendor may commence business upon issuance of the license.
- (b) Any operator, owner, or person driving and/or selling food items from mobile food vending equipment shall be required to pay gross receipts on their sales.
- (c) To obtain a business license, the applicant must adhere to the requirements of Chapter 15, Article II – Business Licenses with additional requirements as follows:
 - (1) An inspection by the county health department must be completed which indicates the facility and foods served are following all state and local laws.

- (a) Mobile food vending in any permitted area shall be allowed only between the hours of 6:00 AM and 11:00 PM.

Section 8 That Chapter 15, Article VII of the Ordinances of the City of Hannibal shall be amended to provide that sections 15-345 through 15-350 shall be reserved.

Section 9 That Chapter 15, Article ix of the Ordinances of the City of Hannibal shall be amended to provide that sections 15-35780through 15-350 shall be reserved.

Section 10 All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, in so far as they conflict, are hereby repealed.

Section 11. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.





Subject: Amend Article 22 (Clothing Allowance) of Union Agreement with I.A.F.F. Local 1211

CC:

In the past few months, the I.A.F.F. Local 1211 and Hannibal Fire Administration have been working together to amend Article 22 (Clothing Allowance) to maximize the funding the city provides for uniforms. Currently each member is issued \$550 but becomes a much smaller amount after paying income tax, sales tax and shipping charges. The \$550 is not enough to provide a new firefighter with all the uniforms they need to get started.

The I.A.F.F. Local 1211 and HFD Administration have agreed to move to a quarter master system where the city will provide uniforms for all firefighters. By buying in bulk and having items in stock, we will be able to provide a better service to provide quality uniforms. Instead of issuing \$550 to each firefighter, we will use this funding to supply the quarter master system. This will be budget neutral for the department.

We propose changing Article 22 to the following:

Quarter Master System - Article 22

All uniform clothing shall be distributed through a quartermaster system. An administrative staff member designated by the Fire Chief shall administer the system. A quartermaster fund consisting of money equal to \$550 for each employee will be provided by the city and utilized for purchase of all clothing. Determinations of the quartermaster regarding specific purchases shall at their sole discretion.

Each employee shall receive a clothing allowance payable on the first pay period in July. The rate of allowance for each member covered by this agreement shall be five hundred fifty (\$550) dollars per year in addition to wages herein provided. In addition to the above uniform allowance, each new member shall receive the sum of two hundred fifty (\$250) dollars to be used as a uniform allowance upon his/her assumption of duties. If Class A uniform is required a one-time additional clothing allowance of three hundred (\$300) shall be given.

AMENDMENT TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the City of Hannibal, a Missouri Municipal Corporation, hereinafter "Employer", entered into a collective bargaining agreement with the Hanibal Fire Fighters Local 1211 of the International Association of Fire Fighters, hereinafter the "Union" effective July 19, 2022.

AND WHEREAS, Article 22 of the said agreement makes certain provisions regarding clothing allowances and the manner in which said allowances are handled;

AND WHEREAS, Employer and Union have discussed the matter and have agreed to amend the existing agreement to provide for the use of a "Quarter Master System", to provide for the acquisition and distribution of clothing.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree that Article 22 of the Existing Agreement shall be amended to read as follows:

CLOTHING ALLOWANCE

Article 22

All uniform clothing shall be distributed through a quartermaster system. An administrative staff member designated by the Fire Chief shall administer the system. A quartermaster fund consisting of money equal to \$550 for each employee will be provided by the city and utilized for purchase of all clothing. Determinations of the quartermaster regarding specific purchases shall at their sole discretion.

The parties further agree that except as modified by or as necessitated by the terms of this amendment that the existing agreement shall be otherwise un-amended and in full force and effect pursuant to the existing terms of the agreement.

Chief Neisen,

On behalf of the membership of Hannibal Firefighters Local 1211, we respectfully submit this letter to propose a change to the current uniform allowance language within our collective bargaining agreement. Our goal is to establish a quartermaster system to better serve both the department and its personnel in maintaining a consistent, professional appearance.

Under this proposal, the existing uniform allowance of \$550 annually per employee would be restructured as a \$550 credit per employee within the quartermaster system. This system would allow for direct collaboration between the Union and Administration to ensure personnel are properly and uniformly equipped, maximizing the value of funds spent on uniforms while alleviating the burden on individual employees to source their own uniform and duty wear.





CONTRACT OF OBLIGATION

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between Hannibal, Missouri and the Missouri Department of Natural Resources hereinafter referred to as the MoDNR.

WHEREAS, Hannibal, Missouri has submitted a permit application for the construction, operation and maintenance of a solid waste disposal area to MoDNR pursuant to the requirements of sections 260.200 to 260.345, RSMo, the Missouri Solid Waste Management Law (hereinafter "Law") and the rules promulgated thereunder; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Missouri Solid Waste Management Rules, 10 CSR 80-2.030(4)(D)7., a municipality or county may execute a "contract of obligation" to satisfy the requirements for a financial assurance instrument in applying for a permit to operate a solid waste disposal area.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the issuance of Permit No. 0117301 and Permit No. 0117303 by MoDNR to Hannibal, Missouri for the operation of a solid waste disposal area and in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, MoDNR and Hannibal, Missouri hereby agree as follows:

1. Hannibal, Missouri is hereby bound unto MoDNR in the sum of \$ 171,040.00 and hereby authorizes the Director of MoDNR, or designee, to collect said sum from any funds being disbursed or to be disbursed by the state of Missouri to Hannibal, Missouri upon failure of Hannibal, Missouri to provide post-closure care for the solid waste disposal area in accordance with the requirements of the Law, the regulations duly promulgated thereunder and the approved post-closure plans.
2. Should MoDNR find that Hannibal, Missouri has failed to properly provide post-closure care for the solid waste disposal area, MoDNR shall notify Hannibal, Missouri of such finding and pursuant to 260.235, RSMo shall afford the opportunity for administrative and judicial review of such finding.
3. Hannibal, Missouri hereby authorizes the Director of the Department of Revenue and the State Treasurer to withhold from any funds being disbursed or to be disbursed by the state of Missouri to Hannibal, Missouri the sum of \$ 171,040.00 upon receiving notice from the Director of MoDNR of Hannibal, Missouri's failure to properly provide post-closure care for the solid waste disposal area.
4. This contract shall terminate upon written notice from MoDNR that Hannibal, Missouri is released from the requirements for a financial assurance instrument for post-closure care as required by the Law and the rules promulgated thereunder.
5. If Hannibal, Missouri desires to terminate this contract prior to completing proper post-closure care for the solid waste disposal area it must:
 - a. Send a notice of termination in writing addressed and delivered to the MoDNR 120 days before that termination will occur; and
 - b. Post with the MoDNR an acceptable alternative financial assurance instrument, as provided for by the Law or by any rules adopted pursuant to the Law within 90 days after the notice of termination is received by the department; and
 - c. Receive a written acknowledgment from the MoDNR of receipt by MoDNR of an acceptable alternative financial assurance instrument. If Hannibal, Missouri does not provide an acceptable alternative financial assurance instrument within the time limit specified above, this contract shall remain in effect until terminated as specified in 4. of this contract.

6. Hannibal, Missouri has by resolution attached hereto as Attachment A and which by this reference is incorporated herein and expressly made a part of the agreement, authorized the signatory hereof to execute this contract of obligation and bind Hannibal, Missouri to the terms thereof.
7. The effective date of this contract is the date this contract is signed by the Director of MoDNR.

Re: Northeast Generation Project – Purchase Power Agreement Ordinance

Background: The electricity necessary to meet the demands of customers served by the Hannibal Board of Public Works (HBPW) requires three separate purchases: energy or the electrons consumed by the electrical appliances, capacity or the available generation on the highest demand day, and transmission or the transportation of the electrons from the source of generation to the HBPW system. Prior to Fiscal Year (FY) 2023, capacity was not budgeted for separately as this cost was very minimal in the overall purchased power budget, less than \$45,000 annually. In the past four years beginning in FY '23, HBPW has spent approximately \$11,600,000 in capacity alone. This drastic increase in the cost of capacity has been driven by increased demand for energy and a decreased supply of generation.

Information Provided: As a result of the recent high capacity costs and the limited availability of capacity in Midcontinent Independent System Operator (MISO) Zone 5, discussions have been ongoing for approximately the past year with other Missouri Public Utility Alliance (MPUA) members who are also MISO Zone 5 market participants. The collaboration from these meetings culminated with the development of the Northeast Generation Project Phase I. Phase I would include a single generator being installed in Fulton, MO and two generators installed in Hannibal, MO resulting in approximately 79 MW of new generation capacity in MISO Zone 5 initially. Future expansion could occur expanding the generation capacity as determined by MPUA members' future needs. The completion of this project would guarantee the availability of 30 MW of Hannibal's capacity requirements at a known cost for the foreseeable future.

Following this memo is an ordinance that with approval would allow the HBPW's participation in Northeast Generation Project Phase I through a Purchase Power Agreement (PPA) with the Missouri Electric Commission (MEC).

Action Requested: Due to time constraints for approval of the PPA, and how the Council and Board meetings have fallen, we are requesting the First Reading of the Ordinance by City Council at the July 15, 2025 meeting. This would allow for the approval of the HBPW Board of Directors at their July 21, 2025 meeting, followed by the Second Reading and adoption at the August 5, 2025 City Council meeting.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF HANNIBAL, MISSOURI, TO ENTER INTO A UNIT POWER PURCHASE AGREEMENT WITH MISSOURI JOINT MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC UTILITY COMMISSION D/B/A MISSOURI ELECTRIC COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the Missouri Joint Municipal Electric Utility Commission d/b/a Missouri Electric Commission (the "Commission") is developing the Northeast Generation Project, a power pool of new electric generating resources consisting of gas-fired turbines expected to enter into commercial operation in 2029 or before to be located in the cities of Hannibal, Missouri and Fulton, Missouri (the "Source"), which will enable the Commission to make sales of certain capacity and energy from the Source to one or more Commission members; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hannibal, Missouri (the "City") desires to enter into a power purchase agreement for a long-term, cost-based purchase from the Commission equaling **38.2%** of the capacity and energy available from the Source that provides benefits similar to those of ownership of the Source; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby found and determined by the City Council of the City that it is necessary and desirable to enter into a power purchase agreement with the Commission to purchase **38.2%** of the capacity and energy produced by the Source in accordance with its terms.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HANNIBAL, MARION COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section I. Approval of the Power Purchase Agreement. The Unit Power Purchase Agreement (the "Power Purchase Agreement"), in substantially the form submitted to and reviewed by the governing body of the City on the date hereof, is hereby approved. The Mayor is authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Power Purchase Agreement on behalf of and as the act and deed of the City, with such changes therein as shall be approved by the Mayor, the Mayor's execution thereof to be conclusive evidence of the approval thereof. The City Clerk is authorized to affix the City's seal thereto and attest said seal.

Section II. Further Authority. The officers, agents and employees of the City, including the Mayor, City Administrator and City Clerk, are authorized and directed to execute all documents and take such actions as they may deem necessary or advisable in order to carry out and perform the purposes of this Ordinance, and to carry out, comply with and perform the duties of the City with respect to the City Documents and to make alterations, changes or additions in the foregoing agreements, statements, instruments and other documents herein approved, authorized and confirmed which they may approve, and the execution or taking of such action shall be conclusive evidence of such necessity or advisability.

Section III. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately after its passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.
