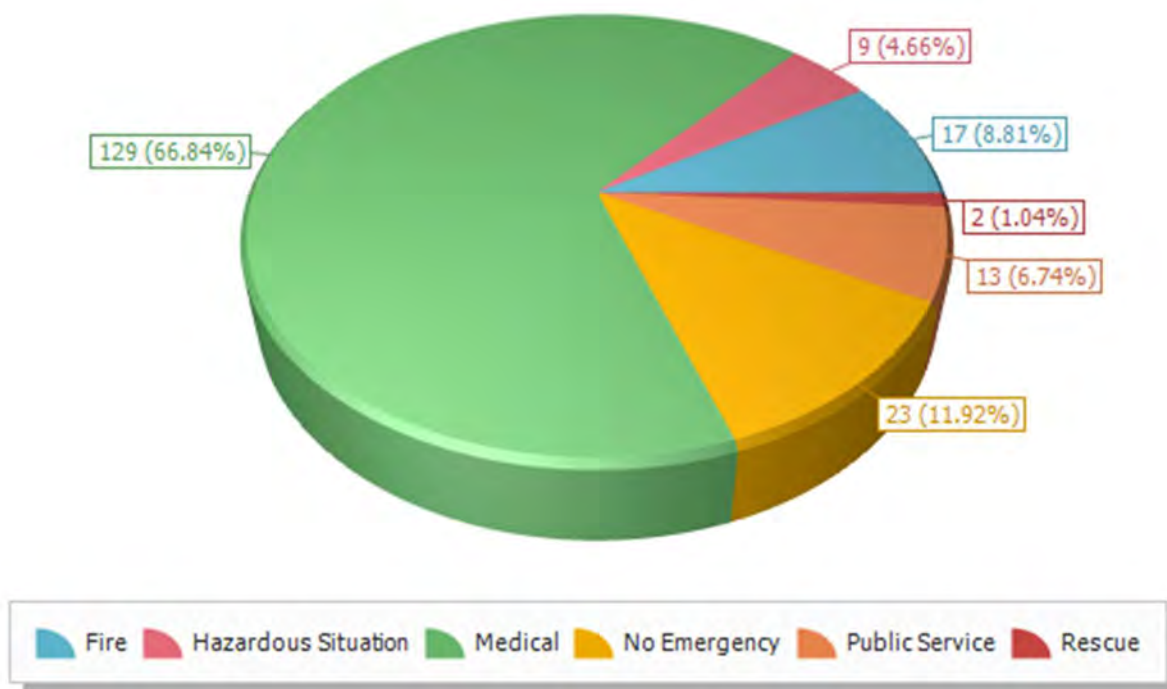
Pump Testing

General Updates

- Meta Ad Results: April's theme was "Springtime is beautiful in Hannibal, and we have all the events and activities to keep you busy, entertained and feeling good" featuring the Loafers Car Show, Twain On Main, Drone Show, Sodalis, Arbor Day event, Bat Day and the Riverfront area.
- Facebook: Total number of views was 5 million (4.8 million from ads and close to 145,000 from organic posts), which was up almost 91%. The views from the paid ads were up 96% and the views from the organic were up 1.6%. Content interactions were 2,700, which stayed consistent with the previous month. Link Clicks were at 6,900, which was an increase of 46%. We gained 226 new followers. There was a notation in the Insights that from April 1-April 4, views data may be undercounted due to a temporary reporting issue. The actual content distribution was not affected.
- Other Social Media Outlets: Instagram insights for March we had 6,000 views, which was a decrease of 86%. We reached 2,000 accounts so that was a decrease of 92%. We added 13 new followers. The previous month's numbers were much higher whereas this month's insights are consistent to all other previous months. While March's numbers looked like a huge growth, it makes me wonder about incorrect data. TikTok – we had two videos – one on the anniversary of the Titanic sinking featuring the Molly Brown House. It performed well compared to our other TikToks, being viewed 1,500 times and a total time play of a little under 5 hours. We gained 18 new followers from that video. The second TikTok was showcasing Great Girlfriend Getaway.
- Website: The total number of visitors to the webpage was 20,000, which was up from 15,000 in March.
- Additional Ad efforts: The ad for Rural MO was published and still waiting to see the one for Show Me Missouri.
- Newsletter: Sent out on April 24th featuring May and June activities such as Twain On Main and Loafers. Sent out 6057 with a 27% open rate. We have placed a newsletter sign up at the front desk for visitors.
- Had a successful Arbor Day 150 event with Tree Board, Parks Dep and MO Conservation.
- Met with journalist Trevor Hughes with USA Today about an article for America 250 and the Mississippi River.
- Hired a part time person and a seasonal person.
- Did an interview with WGEM about Molly Brown for America 250 story.
- Hosted a Travel Writer from London doing a story on Hannibal, MO and the 150 Anniversary.
- Hosted a FAM Tour with a tour bus operator from New York.
- Some Electrical work got completed at the Molly Brown Home.

Group and Convention Marketing

School groups are wrapping up for the school year. I have followed up with the schools after their visits and have received 2 responses back but were positive with their feedback. Have 18 groups that we have worked on or communicated with regarding visits to town for the rest of 2026.

Information Technology: Eric Graham & John Schweiss

Information Technology facilitated an electronics recycling program for both public and a multi-year backlog of electric waste that had been built up across the City. An estimated 20,000lbs of waste were recycled during these events.

IT has been working with the Parks Department to ensure Bear Creek Sports Complex and the Hannibal Aquatic Center are ready to reopen for the season. Additionally, IT has completed the install of outdoor Wi-Fi at Central Park. Consolidating their existing standalone Wi-Fi with City Hall. This project will have annual cost savings of \$1,020.

Information Technology continues to support and advance strategic initiatives across the City. Current efforts include supporting the implementation of Andrews Timekeeping, BS&A ERP system, and CentralSquare public safety software, all of which are foundational to modernizing City operations and improving system integration.

Alongside these initiatives, IT continues to maintain day-to-day operations, providing end-user support and ensuring the reliability, security, and upkeep of all City information systems.
