## **Hannibal Emergency Management: Jacob Nacke, Director**

As spring has arrived, we have begun testing and preparation in the Emergency Operations Center (EOC). We had the IT department onsite and tested the computers and software needed to ensure EOC is prepared to operate in the event of a disaster.

The Salamander mobile credentialing system was tested and is ready to be deployed to track individuals if needed for volunteer work or other critical incident need.

John Schweiss (IT) has been working on the Mobile Command Unit and has added starlink (NECOMM) communications, new video system, and made upgrades to the backup camera system. These upgrades ensure the MCU can be deployed at special events and disasters to help facilitate emergency services.

A comprehensive test of the outdoor warning sirens will be conducted as weather allows. The statewide tornado drill was cancelled due to inclement weather.

## Hannibal Fire Department: Ryan Neisen, Fire Chief

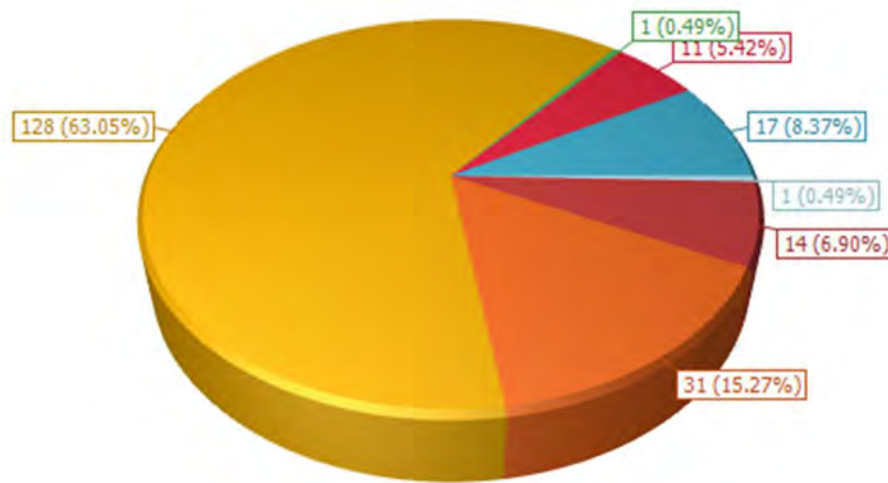
### Training

### **General Updates**

- Meta Ad Results: February's theme was "From can't miss events to visiting the homes of 2 prominent women in the story of Hannibal, March is full of reasons to visit us here in America's Hometown" and we featured Big River Comic Con, Chocolate Extravaganza, the 150th Anniversary parade, the Hannibal Piecemakers Quilt Show, the Becky Thatcher House and the Molly Brown House.
- Facebook: Total number of views was 2.5 million (a little over 2.4 million from ads and over 90,000 from organic posts). The views from the paid ads were down 2% and the views from the organic were also down 40%. Content interactions were 1,500 which was a decline of 45% (in January we had an increase of 37%). Link Clicks were at 2,600, which was an increase of 16%. We gained 68 new followers in February.
- Other Social Media Outlets: Instagram insights for February we had 8,800 views. We reached only 7,400 accounts so that was a decrease of 77%. We had 4 posts but that will increase once events and season picks back up. TikTok – we had one video in February promoting the special events and that got 360 views.
- Website: The total number of visitors to the webpage was 11,000, which was up from 9,000 in January.
- Additional Ad efforts: We did not budget for a print ad for the third quarter due to it being the slower time of the year.
- Newsletter: Sent out on February 23rd and it highlights the upcoming parade, Chocolate Extravaganza, Big River Comic Con as well as Parks and Recreation Department's upcoming events. Sent out 6000 with a 29.4% open rate. We have placed a newsletter sign up at the front desk for visitors.
- Many different marketing avenues are being utilized to promote the 2026 special events for the 150th anniversary of the publication of The Adventures of Tom Sawyer, beginning in March including local advertising such as TV and radio. Other avenues include 2 billboard placements, CTV and Spotify ads outside of the local area
- Hwy 36 guides were received for edits and is officially off to print.
- 97.9 KICK-FM has agreed to broadcast the synchronized music for the Drone Show and live broadcast from Central Park.
- Gobo to be set up after the severe cold temps break at MBH.
- Did a 30 min interview with KCTV 5 -Kansas City News about all things Hannibal for a Podcast called Destination Heartland.
- I did an interview with HLG journalist students about the parade and upcoming events this year.
- Finalized two tv commercials and digital advertising for 2026 events and have been reaching out to businesses, schools and organizations to participate in the parade.
- I gave presentations to 1 million cups attendees about this department, what we do, and the events planned for 2026.

### **Group and Convention Marketing**

Have 11 school groups at this time. Have 19 groups that we have worked on or communicated with regarding visits to town in 2026. Have 2 that have already reached out about 2027 as many of them are working on their future offerings.
